This week we have been at the heart of a national initiative to help schools and colleges in England to develop their use of technology in education as we took part in EdTech Week 2020.

As an EdTech Demonstrator school, a network selected by the Department for Education (DfE) to offer advice, guidance and training in effective use of technology to other schools. We have contributed to live policy panels, professional development sessions and a virtual Edtech Summit, where schools and colleges broadcast live, giving tips and advice to support others. The week also included a contribution from Minister of State for School Standards, Nick Gibb, MP..

We are absolutely thrilled to be involved in the National EdTech programme being able to support schools in the region with the vital skills and tools they need to ensure that pupils can learn remotely. It's been great to be a part of EdTech week and share some of our on-line teaching and learning methods. This is all about teachers helping teachers at the most difficult of times.
