
Young Artists Summer Show





Bounceback Wellbeing

This has been the third week of Bounceback. In EYFS, the children have spoken about kindness and manners all week. The staff have seen lots of random acts of kindness from so many children and are very proud of them. Year 1 children have continued to look at feelings, the different emotions we might go through and different ways we can deal with these emotions. In Year 2, they have looked at the things that are most important to them and what they would take if they were stuck on a desert island. They also considered why it is important to work together as a class team and designed a shield to represent their class. Year 3 and 4 have been learning about guardian angels and how they can be kind to each other. They shared things that they like about each other and have been sharing acts of kindness throughout the week. Year 4 have also been giving their friends extra smiles and compliments; some have written kind notes and left them on their desks too! Year 5 have looked at 'balancing scales' and understanding that although bad things do happen, there are positives and happy thoughts and situations that still occur and could come from it. Year 6 have also focussed on having guardian angels and being kind to each other. They also looked at loss and change and how a loss can also be a gain.

They were learning how to use line, tone and a range of media whilst being inspired by one of the most iconic paintings in the world.
